#### 6. Purpose of the meeting and its role

Researchers and scientists in the field of sleep study gather together from all over the world to explore the relationship between people's sleeping habits and the role of sleep in human lives, and to discuss on their recent findings and research outcomes in the study of sleep-wake rhythm controlling mechanisms and treatment methods of sleep disorders. The ultimate purpose of the congress is to contribute to the development of sleep study in the world.

#### 7. Process of selecting host country and the outline of the Congress

Worldsleep is the congress organized by World Sleep Federation every 4 years, and it counts 6th in 2011 since its first congress in 1991. Asian Sleep Research Society, one of the member societies of the federation, has more than 3,500 members. Despite being the second largest society after the United States of America, the Asian Sleep Research Society has never hosted international meetings not only in Japan, but also in Asian countries.

For this reason, Japanese Society of Sleep Research, which is one of the leading members of the Asian Sleep Research Society, has decided to invite Worldsleep to Japan, and at the Council

Meeting of the World Sleep Federation held in Cairns, Australia in 2007, this invitation has been approved. Upon an approval by the federation, the International Organizing Committee has been set up on August 24th, 2008, and started its first step toward the holding the Worldsleep2011. It is a milestone for the Japanese Society for Sleep Research to host the Worldsleep2011 in its 20th anniversary year, and the impact on societies in Asian and other regions of the world is considered to be uncountable. In recent years, the diversified life styles and shorter sleeping hours have had negative effects on QOL. For example, sleep disorder is prevailed to be one of the causes of hypertension, diabetes, cardiac infarct, mood disorders, and not only of the car accidents as a result of drowsiness in the daytime. Drowsiness in daytime not only triggers accidents, but also decreases the efficiencies of productivities. If such conditions are prolonged, mental and physical conditions are also affected, resulting to mental and mood disorders. As such, the social and economic impacts of sleep disorder cannot be underestimated. It is said that 1 in 4 or 5 people suffer from some kind of sleep troubles, so the problem is not only lack of sleep. The news that a bullet train driver has slept in his duty because he has been suffering from the Sleep Apnea Syndrome (SAS) is still fresh in our memory. Because of its complexity in nature, recent study of "sleep" has multiple approaches not only of sleep medicine, but also sociological approaches from the perspective of socio-economic aspect of sleep, and sleep science from the perspective of the role of sleep and its mechanisms. These 3 approaches have been combined and established a new systemic approach toward sleep, as "Hypnology". At the Worldsleep2011, which is themed as "New Horizons of Sleep Research for Our Planet", we aim at discussing wider area of sleep-related topics, such as sleep disorder, narcolepsy, insomnia, sleep-disordered breathing, sleep mechanism, physio-pharmacology in sleep, as well as its relationship with mood disorder or life style-related diseases, sleep cycle, and neuropharmacological approaches to sleep. In doing so, we anticipate the Worldsleep2011 provides the opportunity to many researchers and scientists in Japan as well as abroad to gather in Kyoto to exchange their recent research outcomes and discuss various opinions. The 36th Annual Meeting of Japanese Society of Sleep Research is jointly held with the Worldsleep2011, and we believe that the year 2011 will be a commemorative year for the further development and expansion of Asian and Japanese Societies of Sleep Research.
